is a free RME resource created by Scripture Union Scotland for first and second level learners in Scottish schools. In line with the curriculum, this resource will explore how and why Christians celebrate Easter.

The videos and supporting resource pack are easy to access and will provide engaging learning opportunities for pupils to develop their knowledge of Christian beliefs and practices. In addition to a series of three videos, there are a number of suggested cross curricular activities to allow the teacher to plan a more in-depth topic if desired







The content of the videos are summarised below. These are designed to be watched in order with both first and second level learners. While eggs and bunnies take a backseat, our videos bring Easter to life with a creative retelling of events that will have children hanging on every word!

EPISODE ONE: PALM SUNDAY


Setting the stage for the events of Holy Week, this episode explores the political dynamics of first century Israel in the Roman Empire. We are dropped in the middle of the action of Palm Sunday, when Jesus arrived in Jerusalem with great celebration. Children learn about the Jewish Passover festival, and why the concept of the Messiah was particularly important in Jerusalem at this time, helping them to understand the beginnings of the Christian faith.

EPISODE TWO: GOOD FRIDAY

The Christian festival of Good Friday is foundational to the understanding and practice of Christianity across the globe. The events of this historic day are considered in this episode, as we take a closer look at the arrest of Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane, his trials before the Roman and Jewish authorities. Why has the cross become the key symbol of Christianity, and why do Christians celebrate these events?

EPISODE THREE: EASTER SUNDAY

Finishing our series on a high and hopeful note, we look at how Christian Holy week culminates in Easter, the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ. The historic and religious impact are explored, as we see how the Christian faith spread from its Jewish roots in Jerusalem all across the ancient Roman empire to become a global faith today.


